

This week



In Maths, we continued to work on multiplication and division and have also worked on number bonds to 10 and 20 and how we can apply this to working with larger numbers. We have also worked on our number doubles and halves, again stretching our brains by working with larger numbers.

In English, we have been revising simple punctuation and looking at more advanced sentence structures. We have also been using our alphabet skills to order lists according to the second and third letter in the word.



In science, we continued to analyse the data from our previous lessons and discussed how we could use this information to help us ask and answer questions about future topics. We also started to think about ways to organise our forthcoming investigation about Izzy the ice cube!

Music

We went to the auditorium to practice and record our Olympic song, so that we can send it to be mixed into the final edit in the USA! It is sung in 3 part harmony and that's the first time we have done that, so it was challenging but it sounded great so was worth the effort! We have looked at a variety of different instruments, some for the first time including maracas, claves, triangles, bongos, djembe, xylophones, metallophones, rain-sticks and egg shakers. We have been guided on how to play them and then spent time learning how to use them. We reacted to visual stimulus that told us to play with varying tempo and dynamics. We were reading from an iconic version of music notation and played *Merrily We Roll Along* by ourselves on the pitched instruments.
