This week



In **Maths**, this week we have been learning about time. We began by learning to tell the time as a group, understanding how to say it as well as read it. We have looked at reading time, drawing times on clocks and converting between analogue and digital clocks. Some children have managed to complete this work and have moved on to a range on time challenges, involving converting between different units of time.



In **English**, we completed revising and editing our stories making sure to add a range of punctuation, adjectives, powerful verbs and similes. An emphasis was also placed on the correct use of inverted commas, commas and following the rules of setting out speech.



In **Science**, we have continued to look at how environments can be changed. The children have talked about changes in the environment, the impact this has and how this effects living things. We are learning about this in preparation for making a poster to display how environmental changes can affect living creatures.

In **Topic**, we further explored the oceans gaining an understanding of waves, tides and currents and their benefits for all marine life.
