
This week

This week we have continued to practice for our Key Stage One performance and were delighted to share it with all of you! We hope you enjoyed it!



In Maths, we learned about multiplication and used our knowledge of multiples of 2, 5 and 10 to help us find out how many eyes different aliens had. We also practiced our mental maths and finding 'one more' and 'one less'.

In English, we started learning about instructional writing. We found out about bossy (imperative) verbs and how to use them and made a sandwich at the request of Sir Percy, the bravest knight in Abu Dhabi. It was great fun making the sandwiches!



In Science, we found out about data collection by asking members of our class about their favourite type of weather. We learned how to record this in a tally chart.
