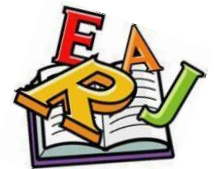

This week

Music

We have finished all the sections of our Olympic song. Now we just have to keep practicing it to make sure it sounds as good as can be! We used our two rhythms (using familiar food words) to analyse the rhythm of *Twinkle Twinkle Little Star* and we started to learn our third rhythm which will help us to build and analyse next week's song! We have also been rehearsing our show songs.
